About the Position: WWU's Youth Programs through Extended Education and Summer Programs (EESP) is seeking temporary part-time positions to teach a specialty topic for elementary and middle school-aged students for summer 2010. Position Responsibilities:

- Develop and deliver daily lessons plans, schedules and budget estimates as requested
- Collaborate on the development and dissemination of program materials
- Deliver instruction according to contract dates and times
- Participate in opening/closing events associated with the specific program

Required Qualifications:

- Candidates must be certified to teach in Washington State
- Be able to teach 20 hours per weekly session
- Have expertise in the specific content area
